- ... the DTM appears for the **eighth time** at **Zandvoort** and, as a result, the circuit is most established DTM event outside of Germany?
- ... the popularity among the spectators is unwaning and has climbed from **40,000** in 2001 to **74,500** last year? An average of **64,286** fans watch the race at Zandvoort every year.
- ... Audi has celebrated four wins at Zandvoort in the last six years?
- ... this run of success started in **2002** when **Mattias Ekström** won his first ever DTM race at Zandvoort with the former Team Abt Sportsline?



... at that time the privateer team around **Hans-Jürgen Abt** also celebrated a title at the same event, namely winning the DTM title with **Laurent Aiello**?

... after returning as factory team to the DTM in the 2004 season Audi celebrated victory in Zandvoort on the way to winning the title with future champion **Mattias Ekström**, and that **Martin Tomczyk** completed a **one-two**?

... Audi won the race near the North Sea again two years later with **Tom Kristensen**?

... the brand's **fourth win** in the dunes was claimed last year when **Martin Tomczyk** led home team-mates **Alexandre Prémat, Mattias Ekström** and **Timo Scheider** in quite literally an Audi phalanx?

... almost one year ago no less than **five Audi drivers, Timo Scheider, Mattias Ekström, Martin Tomczyk, Alexandre Prémat** and **Tom Kristensen,** had occupied the top five spots in Qualifying?

... in addition to the four wins, Audi has recorded a total of **eleven podium finishes** at Zandvoort since **2001**?

... **Mattias Ekström** with **five podium finishes** – including two wins – is the most successful Audi driver between 2002 and 2007?

... thanks to **Audi driver Christijan Albers** the unusually enthusiastic Dutch public can cheer on a **native driver** in the DTM field for the first time since 2004?

... in Mattias Ekström, Tom Kristensen, Martin Tomczyk and also Christijan Albers, the 2003 winner, Audi has four former DTM Zandvoort winners in its ranks?
